Submission Criteria

- Any student or Early Career Professional (defined by APA as those within seven years of receiving their last degree) may submit a poster proposal as the first author and presenter.
- An individual can submit a maximum of **TWO** submissions as the first author and presenter.
- Undergraduate and graduate student presenters are required to get their submissions approved by an individual or co-author with a terminal degree (PsyD, PhD, or JD).
- There are no limitations to the individuals that can be listed as coauthors.

NOTE: Data collection and analysis **do not** have to be complete at the time of submission. But you should expect to be able to complete data collection and analysis by the Spring.

How to Submit a Proposal

All proposals must be submitted online by Sunday, December 13th, 2020 11:59 pm PST.

We *strongly* recommend that you collect all the information for submitting a poster proposal **BEFORE** opening up the submission portal webform. **You will not be able to save your progress on the form and return to it at a later time.** We therefore ask that you **only open the webform when you are ready to submit.** To help you prepare your submission, we have listed all the information you will need to complete your submission below.

Information needed to submit a proposal:

- First Author's name, affiliation and email.
 - If First Author is an undergraduate or graduate student: name and email of the individual or co-author with a terminal degree (PsyD, PhD, JD, or equivalent) that has approved the submission.
- Any coauthor(s) name, affiliation and email. Listed in order of presentation.
- Title of Poster Submission
- An abstract (limited to 100-words) and summary (limited to 1000-words) describing your proposed research poster. *You will need to submit this information in two different formats: 1) in a word doc or comparable file format and 2) copy and pasted into the appropriate text box provided.*
- Indicate the psych-law topic area(s) that relate to your submission.
